I found this article when I was looking for price data. The paper is a bit like a “mosaic” work putting (cut and paste) tables from different sources together. But it does have a useful reference that I thought may be of interest to you if you are still planning to do something similar with students? It is about collecting carcass wt and dressing percentage for different breeds.

This morning I sent an email to bu Eni about the need to discuss and develop work plans for proposed research topics. I think each topic is like a small project and requires a lot of work, so planning is essential. In my email and the attachment, I tried to point out what work is needed IF (and only if) we are aiming at publishing our work in good international journals.

For the impact of IBM on demand for local cattle, I have put your name down as leader. It is the same topic I asked Vitri about some months ago. It is all about supply and demand and how government policies play a big part in affecting both, using IBM imports as an example. This paper will include analysis from EK and KalSel. Could you please as soon as you can look into getting (1) the monthly slaughter data for Banjarmasin/Banjarbaru from 2016-2018, (2) volumes of frozen beef and IBM imports from 2016-2018, and (3) retail prices for local fresh beef, frozen beef and IBM? I understand these are challenging work; otherwise, someone else would have been able to “cut and paste” and publish. May be it is better you go out with Pak Hamdan for this, with a clear understanding of what we are after???

I have written most part of the paper and collected secondary data as much as I can, the rest will depend largely on what data you can get for KalSel.

Pak Ika, I have explained in my email to bu Eni, and have mentioned several times before during our meetings, that UNE will cover the cost associated with market chains, including hiring students. All I need is a budget from you, just like the HH survey, and UNE will reimburse. It would be best in fact to have a budget for the three research topics included in my email to bu Eni this morning. That way we can send the lot together.

I hope this is not too heavy on a Monday. I have been thinking about all these for weeks while waiting for the team to finish the HH survey.

Could you please get a sense of whether the things on my list are doable or not, and the interest from the team? Do I need to explain more? Thanks, Pak Ika.

Attached is the paper that mentioned some of the GoI policies that have affected live cattle and beef exports from Australia. Unfortunately, to me there was not enough details on the policies mentioned. But they may be familiar to you and Vitri.

Below are the policies mentioned in the paper that I would like to have more details:

1. The "May package 1995", on tariffs, page 288
2. The "Presidential Instruction of No. 2/1998" on interisland trade
3. "MOT 24/2011" and its amendments (MOT 46/2013 and others), on regulations on import and export of livestock and livestock products
4. MOT 59/2016 or similar policies that restrict the sales of imported beef at the traditional market. This is an interesting one to me. I would like to know how long they have been? Do they apply to Indian buffalo meat? And Have they been removed, and when (since frozen beef/IBM seems to be everywhere)?

It would be much appreciated if I can get help with these policy questions.

The other thing, Vitri may be able to help is the beef retail prices at major cities. Thanks.
