Comments to the Author

1. Why is odds ratio used as estimate in Figure 3 and not HR?
2. The authors do not explain a rationale for choosing a period of 3 months to exclude individuals who had redeemed a prescription. Why 3 months and not 6 months?
3. In general, the discussion is well written but a number of issues needs to be discussed:
  - discussion of potential of bias in this study. It is conceivable that individuals with lower socioeconomic status may have lower adherence to drugs which may lead to lower use of these drugs in real world. What is the impact of such bias regarding the conclusion? line 363
  - Previous studies suggest an association between lifestyle and socioeconomic position and NSAID use. The authors needs to provide references
  - Although lifestyle and socioeconomic position might be a potential confounder in studies on NSAID-associated cardiovascular risks; the estimates from this study are small and probably affect the associations from previous studies limited.

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
