Traditional Wisdom of Indigenous Indonesian Dayak in Utilizing The Community Preserved Forest in the Era of Reduction of Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation (REDD+)

Abstract: The dynamics of forest management for Dayak communities in Central Kalimantan, Indonesia are derived from the local concept of *Batang Garing* (tree of life) as a symbol of the environment that is understood by the community as a balance between human and natural relations. Therefore, the function of forests for Dayak people is not only to fulfil the needs of life but also related to the responsibility to preserve natural resources for the lives of the future generations. The study aims at analyzing the traditional model of preserving the indigenous conservation area. Applying Focus Group Discussion (FGD) as well as in-depth interviews, this study explored and developed community thought on managing conservation. The result of the study indicates there is a construction of knowledge used to maintain the sustainability of the area; the legend used to strengthen people's understanding of the forest sacred area, an ecological function where lakes, forests and rivers are regarded as areas that influence the continuity of water in the lake. The traditional knowledge obviously has provided sufficient local wisdom to communities in preserving forest areas. Since the government has had stipulated no rules on the conflict settlement between the *adat* law society and the investors concerning the optimization and ownership of natural resources, it is compulsory for investors to live up to the local wisdom in managing the business operation to avoid conflict with local people which is usually ended up with paying for the compensation multiple times.
