Abstract The numbers of women entrepreneurs increases and makes women leave work and start their own business. Social capital is a fundamental resource for women to be entrepreneurial and able to create diverse product designs in accordance with market needs. The main source of mobilization in women's entrepreneurship is determined directly by the amount of social capital that concerns the existence of the company and business development. However, very limited opportunities for women's access to social capital and gender differences in social capital put women entrepreneurs in marginal status. The purpose of this research is to build social capital and increase organizational network resources for the expansion of creating different product designs in women's entrepreneurial space. Sampling was carried out by distributing questionnaires to 150 women entrepreneurs in the province of Bali, Indonesia as a means of data collection. Data analysis was performed by structural equation modeling in smart PLS software. Social capital provides more knowledge on information and resources so that a positive impact on innovation will certainly be very significant for the growth of women's businesses, especially in Bali.

'Social Capital, Knowledge Sharing and Innovation In Women Entrepreneurship' is a contemporary and important area of research. The research uses quantitative methods to collect and analyse its data, which is acceptable, though I would argue that social capital is a qualitative phenomena. Therefore I recommend that the research justification needs to be explicated in a greater depth and breadth of detail.



Overall, the submission lacks critical discussion and hence is too descriptive. I would also recommend reducing the 6 hypotheses to provide a more intense focus for the research. Furthermore, hypotheses 4-6 are self-evident and the research merely confirms what the reader would already know, and thus this part of the research is superfluous.

The sample selection strategy needs to be justified and discussed in a greater level of detail.

The data collection methods appear to be rigorous and comprehensive but again I would recommend a great depth and breath of discussion.

Section 4, which presents 'Results and Discussion' needs to be developed to explain the importance of the results. As it stands the significance of the results and their connections to the 6 hypotheses lack clarity.

The conclusion is too short though this consequently this section should be developed.

There are extensive references, however the key texts and scholars in the social capital and/or social network literature are not included. The standard of expression also varies, for example the first sentence of the abstract is ungrammatical:

'The numbers of women entrepreneurs increases and makes women leave work and start their own business.'

I therefore recommend that the re-submission is subject to a more rigorous proof-reading process to eliminate grammatical mistakes.

The author(s) have worked hard on addressing my recommendations and in consequence this is a much improved submission.

The main reservation I have about the paper is that it is not written in standard English. For example, the first paragraph on p.1 from lines 23-32 is very difficult to understand, as it contains numerous grammatical errors, as well as being expressed with several convoluted



sentence constructions. This paragraph also contains inappropriate verbs, and incorrect capitalisations. The first sentence, which I would expect to hook the reader is as follows:

'Women have been used in several decades of debate in several studies to be a predictor of entrepreneurship [1, 2].'

I have re-read this sentence several times as it is less than clear. In my view this paper would not in its current form be acceptable for publication. I therefore would repeat my previous recommendation for the submission to be subject to a more rigorous proof-reading to eliminate the numerous grammatical mistakes.
