The effectiveness of bridging social capital in fostering relationships and networks among members of diverse social groups is similar to the efficacy of enabling connections and networks (linking social capital) when the focus is external. Edward III model describes the factors that influence policy implementation as follows:

As of MUSDA II in 2017, a total of ten regional deliberations of the Dayak Murung Raya Adat Council have been held.

There must be no room for misunderstanding or misinterpretation in the information that policy implementers (frontline bureaucrats) receive. Murung Raya Regency in Central Kalimantan did not amend the previous Regional Regulation 5/2006 by enacting Perda 33 of 2011 regarding Dayak adat institutions in the district of Gunung Mas, which was found to be confusing in this Institutional Formation Policy.

Thirdly, the reliability of Resource orders

Edward III argues that sufficient funding is crucial for effective policy implementation [13]. Damang is an enduring Dayak tradition that has been practiced in the same region for generations. Damang is the hub institution that is supposed to serve the public in accordance with their individual preferences.
