MODERATING ESG RISK IN THE RELATIONSHIP OF INVESTMENT DECISIONS AND FIRM VALUE

Abstract. Investment decisions by investors and company management not only consider aspects of the company's financial performance but also relate to the company's sustainability on the environment as a responsibility for the environmental impact of the company's activities. The alignment of corporate responsibilities can be seen from the company's concern about Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG). This study aims to analyze the role of ESG risk in moderating the relationship between investment decisions and firm value in the ESG Leader Index (IDXESGL) group of companies on the Indonesia Stock Exchange (IDX). The sample selection was based on purposive sampling on 30 companies for the period 2021-2022 with 3 times the evaluation period of the IDXESGL index so that 24 companies were selected and the number of observational data was 72 observations. Data research analysis using the structural equation model (SEM) method with Partial Least Square (PLS) analysis technique. The results of the analysis show that ESG risk moderates the relationship between investment decisions and firm value. Therefore, the better the company's ESG performance will strengthen the influence of investment decisions on company value, and for the future the company will continue to grow sustainably.

Tracking one Decades of Land Cover Around Gajah Wong River Sub-Watershed Yogyakarta, Indonesia

Abstract. Yogyakarta Special Region is one of the provinces in Indonesia that is actively implementing the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The Gajah Wong River is one of the rivers that flow through the densely populated areas in the Yogyakarta Special Region, which is facing the problem of land-use change in the form of settlement development in the river area. This has the effect of destroying river vegetation diversity and degrading water quality. This study aims to identify land cover changes in the last 10 years or one decade. The method uses Landsat images. The time series used were 1999, 2009, 2019, and 2029. The data were interpreted based on the types of land cover and how the changes occurred during that period. Based on the Landsat imagery the total area of Gajah Wong River Sub-Watershed is 4.394,98 ha and three types of land cover identified, namely: built-up land, rice fields, and plantations. The increase in the area of built-up land types (54%), is in line with the decrease in the area of rice fields (28%) and plantations (26%). Changes in the pattern of land use in the Gajah Wong River Sub-watershed, are in line with the increase in the number of developments that will be made and affecting the river.
