The study E-Courts in Indonesia: Exploring the Opportunities and Challenges for Justice and Advancement to Judicial Efficiency focused on the implementation of electronic trials in Indonesian civil procedures law (ICPL). It highlights the lengthy and complex nature of civil trials based on HIR/RBG and the response of the Indonesian Supreme Court in issuing "PERMA Number 1 of 2019" to address these issues. The abstract discusses the benefits, opportunities, and challenges associated with e-trials, emphasizing their effectiveness in providing timely justice and improving the efficiency of the judiciary. However, it lacks critical analysis of certain aspects and would benefit from additional information on the research methodology.

- The abstract effectively sets the context by highlighting the existing problems in civil trials in Indonesia and the Supreme Court's response through the issuance of "PERMA Number 1 of 2019". It should also highlight the benefits of e-trials, such as reducing the need for physical presence in court, simplifying case registration, and enabling electronic payment and summoning of parties. These points will provide a clear understanding of the advantages that electronic trials can bring to the Indonesian judicial system.
- 2. The paper lacks a critical analysis of the challenges associated with implementing electronic trials. It briefly mentions the obstacles and limitations but does not delve into them in detail. It would have been beneficial to explore potential concerns, such as technological infrastructure, cybersecurity, potential biases in virtual proceedings, and ensuring equal access to justice for all parties. Addressing these challenges would have provided a more balanced perspective on the feasibility and implications of e-trials in ICPL.
- 3. The paper mentions that the study utilized a qualitative normative judicial approach, but it does not provide any information on the specific research methodology employed. Including an explanation of the research design, data collection methods, and sources

- of data would have enhanced the abstract's credibility and helped readers understand the basis for the study's findings.
- The paper does emphasize the theoretical and practical implications of the research but lacks specific examples or details. It would be helpful to provide concrete examples of the theoretical contributions and practical applications of the study's findings, as well as how they can inform future research or policy development in the context of electronic trials.

It provides an overview of the implementation of electronic trials in Indonesia , including the introduction of the E-Court application and the benefits it offers. However, the section lacks specific findings from the research study being reviewed. It would be more informative to include empirical findings or insights derived from the qualitative analysis of the data. Without specific research findings, the discussion remains primarily descriptive and does not contribute significantly understanding of the topic.
- The text generally follows a logical structure with clear headings for each section. However, there are some instances where the transition between paragraphs and subsections could be improved for better coherence and flow. Additionally, the use of subheadings within each subsection could enhance the organization and readability of the text, making it easier for readers to follow the main points and arguments.
- The text includes citations and references to support the claims made throughout the review . However , there are inconsistencies in the formatting and style of the citations , which should be addressed for clarity and consistency . Additionally , providing in-text citations for specific statements or claims would improve the traceability of the information presented.
