It provides a clear context for the reader. It should also set the scope of the study by briefly explaining the significance of mining permits, the link between mining law and environmental law, and the problems associated with mismanagement and corruption.
- 2. The literature review part does well in highlighting the detrimental environmental impacts of illicit mining, such as water contamination , deforestation , and biodiversity decline . This creates a compelling case for the need for strong environmental law enforcement . It should also give an overview of Indonesia 's legislative framework related to environmental protection, which provides context for the subsequent discussion on enforcement.
- 3. The authors must acknowledge the complexity of issues related to illegal mining, such as social unrest, criminal behavior, and economic inequalities. This will add depth to the discussion and show an understanding of the multifaceted nature of the problem.
- 4. The mention of corruption in the mining sector is critical, as it highlights a significant challenge. However, it would be beneficial to provide some examples or case studies to illustrate the extent of corruption.

5. The discussion of mismanagement during the decentralization era is insightful, but it could be further enriched with data or concrete examples to strengthen the argument.

However, the literature review must effectively identify the research gap related to the impact of public environmental regulation on private lenders ' monitoring efforts and their effectiveness in mitigating corporate pollution.
- 2. The review cites recent studies (Choy et al., 202; hao et al., 2022; Shi et al., 2021) to support the research background, indicating that the study is up-to-date with the latest research in the field.
- 3. The methodology section is clear and well-structured. It explains the research philosophy, approach, data sources, and methods employed in the study. The rationale for choosing a qualitative research methodology is provided, emphasizing its ability to provide a comprehensive understanding of the issue. However, it might be useful to briefly mention the limitations of this approach.
- 4. The authors should discuss specific legislation related to environmental protection and mining, such as the ineral and Coal ining aw, Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulation, Forestry aw, arine and Fisheries aw, and others. This detail is beneficial for readers seeking specific information.
- 5. The limitations section should mention challenges related to data collection, the evolving nature of illegal mining, and the complexity of social and political factors. This is essential for acknowledging the constraints of the study.
